The Maui Historical Society, in partnership with The Maui Chinese Cultural Society, is proud to host this year's mid Autumn Chinese Moon Festival on the grounds of Hale Ho`ike`ike, Bailey House Museum in Wailuku on Sunday, September 27, 2015 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Cultural presentations, activities, and demonstrations include a morning Tai Chi Workshop lead by Leola Muromoto & Cathy Kekiwi, Moon Festival History & Cultural Practices presentation by Dr. Busaba Yip of Wo Hing Museum, a behind-the-scenes look at the Kung Fu movements that make up the Lion Dance and the traditional beliefs for feeding the Lion with Sifu Steve Catugal of the Maui Chinese Martial Arts Academy, a Chinese cooking demonstration using traditional Chinese flavors with an updated twist by Executive Chef Tom Muromoto and Executive Sous Chef Chris Napoleon of Kaanapali Beach Hotel, and a Chinese calligraphy demonstration followed by a hands-on Chinese calligraphy workshop with Julie Shiotsugu. Also featured will be Chinese music, dance, and legends surrounding the celebration of the Moon Festival, Chinese ribbon dancing, information and education on Feng Shui, acupuncture, and the Chinese Tea Ceremony, including the Moon Festival ritual table, the symbolic fruits and vegetables, and the actual tea ceremony with a tea sampling to follow.

A special feature of the Chinese Moon Festival will be the opening of a traveling photographic display and artifact exhibition highlighting the historical Chinese families and communities of Maui by Ron & Leola Muromoto. This is a free exhibition that will be available for viewing during regular museum hours, Monday through Saturday, 10 am to 4 pm, from Sunday, September 27 until Saturday, October 17.

Food booths are: Kaanapali Beach Hotel, Royal Kitchen, Ululani's Shave Ice & Manapua, The Maui Chinese Club's Mooncakes, and the Maui Historical Society's Drink Booth. Other booths include Iao Acupuncture & Spa, Succulent Gardens by Sarah Shim, and Aloha Botanicals Maui.
